<u>Minutes of the Mission Directorate Meeting (Video Conference) of National AYUSH</u> <u>Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23:</u>

1. The Mission Directorate Meeting (Through Video Conference) of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23 was held on 28.07.2022 under the Chairmanship of Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, AYUSH, to consider the State Annual Action Plan (SAAPs) of Jammu & Kashmir, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh and Meghalaya. List of the participants is enclosed at Annexure-I.

2. At the outset, Shri D. Senthil Pandiyan, Joint Secretary, AYUSH welcomed the representatives of State Governments to the Mission Directorate meeting and briefed that the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) for the States/UTs of Jammu & Kashmir, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Andhra Pradesh and Meghalaya have already been appraised during the Appraisal Committee meeting and detailed observations were communicated to the States.

It was also informed to the Mission Directorate that during the Appraisal Meeting, a 3. detailed review of progress of Expenditure, submission of Utilization Certificates (UCs) and PFMS Implementation has been carried out and it was suggested that State/UT Governments has to expedite the progress of expenditure and to ensure submission of UCs of at least 75% of the previous released grants-in-aid. Further, it has been highlighted by JS(DSP) that Department of Expenditure has issued guideline vide OM No. F.N.1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2022and Corrigendum dated 21.06.2022regarding release of first installment of funds for 2022-23 to the States and UTs. As per the issued guideline, they have highlighted that "Funds available in the bank account of SNA should not be more than the first installment of Central share likely to be released to a State in 2022-23 including corresponding State share." Accordingly, it is required that States/UTs has to fulfill the compliance of different conditionalities of above mentioned guidelines which has already been communicated to the Chief Secretaries of all States/ UTs for kind information by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India and during the mean time they have to also ensure maximum expenditure against the funds available in the bank account of SNA, so that grant-in-aid of first installment may be released to the State /UT Governments during the current year.

4. After that a brief presentation made by Deputy Adviser (Ayu.) for each State highlighting the following aspects of

i. Year-wise Progress of expenditure and status of UCs submitted under NAM

- ii. Status of AYUSH HWCs
- iii. Status of setting up of up to 50 Bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals
- iv. Status of New AYUSH Educational Institutions.
- v. Status of submitted SAAP during 2022-23.
- vi. Status of implementation of PFMS.

The State-wise detailed observation are enclosed in ANNEXURE-II.

ANDAMAN & NICOBAR ISLANDS

Mission Directorate reviewed the Expenditure & Utilization Certificates status of the UT Govt. against the previous year's grants-in-aid released to the UT Govt. under the NAM scheme, Status of PFMS implementation, Status of Ayush HWCs, Status of submitted State Annual Action Plan and made the following observations and recommendations:

Expenditure & Utilization Certificates

Status of Expenditure:

Under NAM, an amount of Rs. 2173.355 Lakhs (Centre Share -Rs. 2080.100 Lakhs and UT Share - Rs.93.255 Lakhs) has been sanctioned from the year 2014-15 to 2021-22. UT Govt. has reported an expenditure of Rs. 1627.816 Lakhs (78.25%) against central share and Rs. 93.255 Lakhs (100%) against the State share.

Mission Directorate suggested UT Govt. to ensure compliance of issued guideline of Department of Expenditure vide OM no F. No. 1/(33)/PFMS/2022 dated 07th July 2022, a onetime relaxation from the DoE's instructions issued vide OM dated 20th May, 2022 is granted to the States/UTs to transfer the central share received on or before 31st March, 2022 under a CSS to the SNA account by 20th July, 2022 failing which such central share shall be returned to the CFI by the State Government through RBI advice. In this regard, UT representative informed that they will take necessary steps for the resolution of the previous year's lying funds in the treasury at the earliest.

Status of Utilization Certificates (UCs):

UT has submitted UCs for an amount of Rs.1572.573 Lakhs (77.36%) including refund of Rs. 235.327 Lakhs against the UC due of Rs. 2032.705 Lakhs. Mission Directorate suggested that UT has to ensure effective utilization of previous years released grant-in -aid in time bound manner and submission of the UCs for the same to the Ministry. Accordingly, UT Government has agreed that they will expedite the process of utilization of released grant-in-aid and submit Utilization Certificates for the same by August, 2022.

Joint Secretary (Ayush), highlighted that as per issued guidelines of Deptt. of Expenditure of dated 23.03.2021, it is required that State Government has to take immediate steps regarding the transfer of released Central Share from State treasury to Single Nodal Account (SNA) at the earliest (within a period of 21 days of its receipt) and they have to also ensure that corresponding State Share should also be released as early as possible and not later than the 40 days of release of Central Shareand to utilize the 75% of the released amount (both Central and State share).

It was appraised during the meeting that a D.O. letter has been issued by the Finance Secretary, Dept. of Expenditure to the Chief Secretaries of all State /UT Governments vide D.O. No. 1(13)/PFMS/2020 dated 13-04-2022, with a request that the Central share of funds for a CSS, released by the Government of India to the Consolidated Fund of the State, should reach the Single Nodal Agency (SNA) account in 21 days. Further, it was also highlighted in the letter that a check has been operationalized in PFMS that if a previous installment of Central share released by the Government of India has not reached from State Treasury to SNA's account, sanction order for subsequent installment of Central share will not be generated.

Status of PFMS

The UT is on-board on PFMS.

The UT Government has to take immediate steps to make all AYUSH HWCs fully functional fulfilling all the criteria of functional stage I and II as it is a part of Ayushman Bharat Scheme which is a flagship programme of the Government and is being monitored at the level of Cabinet Secretariat.

8. Status of State Annual Action Plan for the year 2022-23

UT Govt. of Andaman and Nicobar Islands has submitted the State Annual Action Plan of 2022-23 for an amount of **Rs. 294.78296 Lakhs** under the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) against the resource pool of Rs. 733.10 Lakhs under the National AYUSH Mission (NAM).

It was noticed by the Mission Directorate that State has submitted the Utilization Certificate upto 75%.Further, Mission Directorate decided to consider State Annual Action Plan for approval as appraised by the Appraisal Committee **subject to condition that State Government has to fulfill conditions of Department of Expenditure issued guidelines vide no. F.N.1 (13)** PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2022 regarding procedure for release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) and monitoring utilization of the funds.
