MINUTES for the Mission Directorate Meeting of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23

- 1. The Mission Directorate Meeting (Through Video Conference) under the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23 was held on dated 14th June, 2022 under the Chairmanship of Shri. Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH to consider the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) of State Government of Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal and **Mizoram**. List of the participants is enclosed at **Annexure-I**.
- 2. At the outset, Shri D. Senthil Pandiyan, Joint Secretary, AYUSH welcomed the representatives of State Governments to the Mission Directorate meeting and briefed that the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) for the States of Chhattisgarh, Uttarakhand, West Bengal and **Mizoram** have already been appraised during the Appraisal Committee meeting and detailed observations were communicated to the States.
- 3. Further, it was also informed to the Mission Directorate that during the Appraisal Meetings, a detailed review of progress of Expenditure and PFMS Implementation has been carried out. It was suggested that State Governments has to expedite the progress of expenditure and to ensure submission of UCs of at least 75% of the previous released grants-in-aid. Further, it is also required to fulfill the compliance of different conditionalities including PFMS implementation which are the necessary criteria for release of grant as per the direction issued by the Department of Expenditure vide no. F.N.1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2021.
- 4. After that a brief presentation made by Deputy Adviser (Ayu) for each State highlighting the following aspects of
- i. Year-wise Progress of expenditure and status of UCs submitted under NAM
- ii. Status of AYUSH HWCs
- iii. Status of setting up of up to 50 Bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals
- iv. Status of submitted SAAP during 2022-23.
- vi. Status of implementation of PFMS.

The State-wise detailed observation are enclosed in ANNEXURE-II.

Mizoram

Mission Directorate reviewed the Expenditure & Utilization Certificates status of the State Govt. against the previous years grants-in-aid released to the State under the NAM scheme, Status of PFMS implementation, Status of Ayush HWCs, Status of submitted State Annual Action Plan and made the following observations and recommendations:

Expenditure & Utilization Certificates

- Status of Expenditure: Under NAM, an amount of Rs. 4064.778 Lakhs (Rs. 3658.254 lakhs as Central Share + Rs. 406.471 lakh as Matching State Share) has been approved from the year 2014-15 to 2021-22. State Govt. has reported expenditure of Rs. 3316.428 lakhs (81.58 %), Rs. 3014.80 lakhs (82.41 %) against central share and Rs. 301.628 lakhs (74.21%) against State share to Ministry. It was observed that Central share amounting to Rs. 194.74 Lakhs and state share of Rs. 21.637 lakhs is still lying pending in the treasury and in this regard Mission Directorate suggested that state has to take appropriate measures, so that it may be transferred to SNA at the earliest.
- Status of Utilization Certificates: State has submitted UCs for an amount of Rs. 2545.593 lakhs (71.45 %) against the UCs due amount of Rs. 3562.694 Lakhs. In the meeting, it was suggested that State has to ensure effective utilization of release grant in time bound manner and submission of the UCs for the same to the Ministry. Further, during the meeting it was suggested that the State Govt. has to explore the possibility for returning the unspent amount lying with the State Govt.

Joint Secretary (Ayush), highlighted that as per issued guidelines of Dept. of Expenditure of dated 23.03.2021, it is required that State Government has to take immediate steps regarding the transfer of released Central Share from State treasury to Single Nodal Account (SNA) at the earliest (within a period of 21 days of its receipt) and they have to also ensure that corresponding State Share should also be released as early as possible and not later than the 40 days of release of Central Shareand to utilize the 75% of the released amount (both Central and State share).

It was appraised during the meeting that a DO letter has been issued by the Finance Secretary, Dept. of Expenditure to the Chief Secretaries of all State /UT Governments vide D.O. No. 1(13)/PFMS/2020 dated 13-04-2022, with a request that the Central share of funds for a CSS, released by the Government of India to the Consolidated Fund of the State, should reach the Single Nodal Agency (SNA) account in 21 days. Further, it was also highlighted in the letter that a check has been operationalized in PFMS that if a previous installment of Central share

released by the Government of India has not reached from State Treasury to SNA's account, sanction order for subsequent installment of Central share will not be generated.

Status of PFMS

The State is on-board on PFMS.

AYUSH Health & Wellness Centres (Ayush HWCs):-

It was highlighted by Secretary Ayush during the meeting that State officials of Government have to orient themselves with respect to different guidelines of the National Ayush Mission Scheme and they have to establish a hierarchy in referral mechanism from Ayush dispensary up to primary and secondary care level hospitals available in the State so that appropriate health services may be provided to the beneficiaries through different Ayush health facilities.

Status of State Annual Action Plan for the year 2022-23

During the Mission Directorate meeting held on 26.05.2022, it was appraised that State Government has submitted the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) of 2022-23 for an amount of Rs. 1096.308 Lakhs which had been pruned for Rs. 211.844 lakhs as per the discussion held during appraisal committee meeting held on dated 04.05.2022 and same had been discussed during Mission Directorate meeting. In the Mission Directorate meeting, Dr. S. Mara Thansiami, Deputy Director (Ayush) had highlighted that she could not produce the facts for different activities as projected in SAAP due to health related issues and further emphasised that some of the important ongoing activities like functioning of 10 bedded co-located Ayush facilities of the different Districts Hospitals (DHs) is required to be supported for manpower under NAM. In this regard, Secretary (Ayush) has suggested that State Govt has to submit a revised SAAP and project their demand with appropriate justification for further appraisal by the Appraisal Committee meeting, so that, same may be considered during the Mission Directorate meeting for further approval.

Accordingly, the State Government has submitted the revised SAAP for an amount of Rs. 930.800 lakh (Rs. 923.600 lakhs as per calculation) against the resource pool of Rs. 242.400 lakhs for different activities which was discussed on 09.06.2021 during Appraisal Committee meeting. Further, Mission Directorate decided to consider State Annual Action Plan for approval as appraised by the Appraisal Committee subject to condition that State Government has to

fulfill conditions of Department of Expenditure issued guidelines vide no. F.N.1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2021, regarding procedure for release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) and monitoring utilization of the funds.
