## Approval of the Mission Directorate under National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the submitted State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) of the year 2020-21.

- 1. The Appraisal Committee Meeting (Through Video Conference) under National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2020-21 was held on dated 17<sup>th</sup> June, 2020 under the Chairmanship of Shri. Roshan Jaggi, Joint Secretary, Ministry of AYUSH to discuss the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) of State Govt. of **Sikkim**. List of the participants is enclosed at **Annexure-I**.
- 2. At the outset, after welcoming the State representatives to the meeting Joint Secretary (AYUSH) informed the State Government to expedite the implementation of National AYUSH Mission (NAM) scheme and try their best to utilize the grants which was approved in the previous years so that actual outcome of the scheme may be fulfilled. The Appraisal Committee discussed the SAAP of the State Govt. of Sikkim.
- 3. Appraisal Committee firstly reviewed the expenditure status of the State Govt. against the previous year's grants-in-aid released to them by Ministry of AYUSH under NAM scheme and the status of Utilization Certificates submitted by the State Government. It is observed that Ministry of AYUSH has released an amount of Rs. 2329.646 Lakhs to the State Govt. of Sikkim from the year 2014-15 to 2019-20 under NAM scheme. As per the physical and financial progress report submitted by State Govt. as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2020 they have reported expenditure for an amount of Rs. 1888.797 Lakhs. Out of the reported expenditure State Govt. has submitted the Utilization Certificates (UCs) for an amount of Rs. 1616.296 Lakhs. It is also observed that against the submitted UCs of Rs. 1616.296 Lakhs, UCs for an amount of Rs.110.12 lakhs has already been liquidated; however, UCs for remaining amount of Rs. 1506.176 lakhs could not be liquidated due to certain shortcomings and relevant supporting documents. In this regard State Govt. is required to furnish the clarification and relevant supporting documents to the Ministry at the earliest so that UCs of the said amount may be liquidated.
- 4. It has been highlighted during the Appraisal Committee meeting that State Govt. has to expedite for process of Utilization of balance amount of grant-in-aid as available with them against the previous year's releases and furnish the UCs of the same to the ministry at the earliest. It was also suggested that State Govt. has to monitor the activity wise status of utilization of funds and if they observe that utilization of grant is not possible in a particular activity then they have to explore the possibility of utilization of grant in some other activities with due approval and if it is not possible then the said amount may be refunded to the Government of India, so that unwanted parking of funds may be avoided.
- 5. After that JS (RJ) has discussed the progress of AYUSH HWCs. In this regard, representative of Ayushman Cell highlighted the target of HWCs for the year 2019-20 was 12 units and for the year 2020-21 is 20 units which were already communicated to the State Govt. It is observed that during the year 2019-20 State had not been given assistance for HWC in the year 2019-20.
- 6. JS (RJ) also highlighted that State Govt. has to take up the necessary steps for recruitment of the Yoga instructor & deployment of Community Health Officer (CHO) and training of the manpower at proposed AYUSH HWCs on priority basis. Further, it was also suggested that appointment of the Yoga instructors may be done from the local area for smooth functioning of Yoga related activities in proposed AYUSH HWCs. During the appraisal committee meeting, the State Govt informed that they will post Mid level Healthcare Providers as CHO in the AYUSH HWCs. Since, there is a provision in the Operational Guideline of AYUSH HWC, that only AYUSH Physician will be appointed as CHO in the AYUSH HWC, the appraisal committee requested the State to submit the proper justification on the issue within one week. Now, State has also submitted justification regarding the same that Sikkim being a small Himalayan State, there is an acute shortage of qualified AYUSH doctors which leads to imbalance in the demand and supply

ratio of the AYUSH doctors and due to which State is unable to appoint them as CHO in the proposed health & wellness centres, as under operational guidelines of AYUSH HWC. Further, State has mentioned that they are unable to appoint AYUSH doctors from neighboring States as well as there is shortage of AYUSH doctors in neighboring States too. Therefore, State has requested to allow them to post Staff nurse/MLHP (Mid Level Health Providers) as CHO and assured the Ministry that these will be trained thoroughly before deployment in all these proposed health & wellness centres. Accordingly, Mission Directorate has considered the request of State Govt.

- 7. It has also been suggested during the meeting that State Govt. has to furnish the latest status along with photographs of construction work with respect to the major activities like 50 Bedded Integrated AYUSH Hospitals, New AYUSH Education Institutes, Drug Testing laboratories, ASU & H pharmacies etc. Further, State Govt. was also requested that, if any facility has been upgraded with the assistance as availed under NAM both photographs i.e. before upgradation & after upgradation is required to be provided along with progress report.
- 8. It was suggested by the appraisal committee that the State Govt. is required to submit the latest expenditure report as on date, so that current position of expenditure may be analysed. It was also suggested that State Govt. has to submit the audited / provisional UCs at least around 75% of the pending amount. Accordingly, State Govt. has reported Rs. 2011.4859 lakhs as latest expenditure as on date 26.06.2020 received through mail. Further, State has not submitted provisional UCs yet and is requested to submit the audited / provisional UCs for an amount of Rs. 395.1899 Lakhs (Rs. 2011.4859 Lakhs Rs. 1616.296 Lakhs) against the reported expenditure. The State Government has also assured that, they will spend remaining amount within next 3-4 months. Further, they have requested for approval of current year SAAP and release of Central grant-in aid.
- 9. The State Government of Sikkm has submitted the SAAP for an amount of Rs. 968.632 Lakhs under National AYUSH Mission (NAM). The State resource pool communicated to them was Rs. 368.3 Lakhs. The submitted SAAP was discussed during the Appraisal Committee meeting and the committee suggested the State to prioritize the SAAP as per resource pool. Accordingly, State has submitted the prioritized SAAP in accordance with resource pool. Appraisal Committee Meeting recommended the proposal for an amount of Rs. 368.302 lakhs as per the prioritized SAAP submitted by State and as per the recommendations of the Appraisal Committee following decision has been taken by the Mission Directorate:-

## Approval of Mission Directorate Meeting on the Proposal of AYUSH HWCs of Sikkim for the Year 2020-21

The Ministry has given the target of 12 Health Sub-centers for the year 2019-20 and 20 Health Sub-centers for the year 2020-21 (total 32 AYUSH HWCs) to be upgraded as AYUSH HWCs in the State of Sikkim. The State had not been given assistance for HWC in the year 2019-20. However, they had proposed for assistance for 18 Health Sub-centers in their SAAP of the year 2020-21.

The Mission Directorate approved the proposal of 18 Health Sub-centers and suggested the State to propose 14 more Health Sub-centers to achieve the target for the year 2019-20 and 2020-21.

During the Appraisal Committee meeting, the State Govt informed that they will post Mid Level Healthcare Providers as CHO in the AYUSH HWCs. Since, there is a provision in the Operational Guideline of AYUSH HWC, that only AYUSH Physician will be appointed as CHO in the AYUSH HWC, the state was requested to submit the proper justification on the issue. Now, State has also submitted justification regarding the same vide letter No. 118/AYUSH/H&FW Deptt. dated 15/07/2020 that Sikkim being a small Himalayan State, there is an acute shortage of qualified AYUSH doctors which leads to imbalance in the demand and supply ratio of the AYUSH doctors and due to which State is unable to appoint them as CHO in the proposed health & wellness centres, as under operational guidelines of AYUSH HWC. Further, State has mentioned that they are unable to appoint AYUSH doctors from neighbouring States as well as there is shortage of AYUSH doctors in neighbouring States too. Therefore, State has requested to allow them to post Staff nurse/MLHP (Mid Level Health Providers) as CHO and assured the Ministry that these will be trained thoroughly before deployment in all these proposed health & wellness centres. Accordingly, Mission Directorate has considered the request of State Govt.
