# MINUTES for the Mission Directorate Meeting (Video Conference) of National AYUSH Mission(NAM) for the year 2022-23

- 1. The Mission Directorate Meeting (Through Video Conference) of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23 was held on 27-07-2022 under the Chairmanship of Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, AYUSH, to consider the State Annual Action Plans (SAAPs) of **Tamil Nadu**, Arunachal Pradesh, Rajasthan & Chandigarh. List of the participants is enclosed at **Annexure-I**.
- 2. At the outset, Shri D. Senthil Pandiyan, Joint Secretary, AYUSH welcomed the representatives of State/UT Governments to the Mission Directorate meeting and briefed that the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) for the States /UTs of **Tamil Nadu**, Arunachal Pradesh, Rajasthan & Chandigarh have already been appraised during the Appraisal Committee meeting and detailed observations were communicated to the States.
- **3.** It was also informed to the Mission Directorate that during the Appraisal Meeting, a detailed review of progress of Expenditure, submission of Utilization Certificates (UCs) and PFMS Implementation has been carried out and it was suggested that State Governments has to expedite the progress of expenditure and to ensure submission of UCs of at least 75% of the previous released grants-in-aid. Further, it has been highlighted by JS (DSP) that Department of Expenditure has issued guideline vide OM No. F.N.1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2022 and Corrigendum dated 21.06.2022 regarding release of first installment of funds to the States and UTs during current year 2022-23. As per the issued guideline, they have highlighted that "Funds available in the bank account of SNA should not be more than the first installment of Central share likely to be released to a State in 2022-23 including corresponding State share." Accordingly, it is required that States/UTs has to fulfill the compliance of different conditionalities of above mentioned guidelines which has already been communicated to the Chief Secretaries of all States/ UTs for kind information by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India and during the mean time they have to also ensure maximum expenditure against the funds available in the bank account of SNA, so that grant-in-aid of first installment may be released to the State /UT Governments during the current year.
- **4.** After that a brief presentation made by Deputy Adviser (Ayu) for each State highlighting the following aspects of
- i. Year-wise Progress of expenditure and status of UCs submitted under NAM
- ii. Status of AYUSH HWCs
- iii. Status of setting up of up to 50 Bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals
- iv. Status of New AYUSH Educational Institutions.
- v. Status of submitted SAAP during 2022-23.
- vi. Status of implementation of PFMS.

The detail observation are enclosed in ANNEXURE-II.

#### Tamil Nadu

Mission Directorate reviewed the Expenditure & Utilization Certificates status of the State Govt. against the previous year's grants-in-aid released to the State under the NAM scheme, Status of PFMS implementation, Status of Ayush HWCs, Status of submitted State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) and made the following observations and recommendations:

#### **Expenditure & Utilization Certificates**

#### **Status of Expenditure:**

Under NAM, an amount of Rs. 20237.300 Lakhs (Centre Share – Rs. 12142.380 Lakhs and State Share – Rs. 8094.920 Lakhs) has been sanctioned from the year 2014-15 to 2021-22. State Govt. has reported expenditure of Rs. 10,709.190 Lakhs (88.20 %), Rs. 7,139.460 Lakhs (88.20 %) against central share and Rs. 4963.90 Lakhs (77.94 %) against State share to Ministry.

#### • <u>Status of Utilization Certificates</u>:

State has submitted UCs for an amount of **Rs. 7,372.71 Lakhs** (64.06 %) against the UC due of **Rs. 11690.279 Lakhs**. In the meeting, Mission Directorate suggested that State has to ensure effective utilization of previous years released grant-in -aid in time bound manner and submission of the UCs for the same to the Ministry. Accordingly, State Government has agreed that they will expedite the process of utilization of released grant-in-aid and submit Utilization Certificates for the same by 05<sup>th</sup> August, 2022. Further, during the meeting it was suggested that the State Govt. has to explore the possibility for returning the unspent amount lying with the State Govt.

Joint Secretary (Ayush), highlighted that as per issued guidelines of Dept. of Expenditure of dated 23.03.2021, it is required that State Government has to take immediate steps regarding the transfer of released Central Share from State treasury to Single Nodal Account (SNA) at the earliest (within a period of 21 days of its receipt) and they have to also ensure that corresponding State Share should also be released as early as possible and not later than the 40 days of release of Central Share and to utilize the 75% of the released amount (both Central and State share).

It was appraised during the meeting that a DO letter has been issued by the Finance Secretary, Dept. of Expenditure to the Chief Secretaries of all State /UT Governments vide D.O. No. 1(13)/PFMS/2020 dated 13-04-2022, with a request that the Central share of funds for a CSS, released by the Government of India to the Consolidated Fund of the State, should reach the Single Nodal Agency (SNA) account in 21 days. Further, it was also highlighted in the letter that a check has been operationalized in PFMS that if a previous installment of Central share released by the Government of

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India has not reached from State Treasury to SNA's account, sanction order for subsequent installment of Central share will not be generated.

#### **Status of PFMS**

The State is on-board on PFMS.

#### **AYUSH HWCs**

The State Government has to take immediate steps to operationalize all Ayush HWCs as it is a part of Ayushman Bharat Scheme which is a flagship programme of the Government.

#### Status of State Annual Action Plan (SAAP)

The State Government has submitted the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) for an amount of **Rs. 14485.510 Lakhs** under the National AYUSH Mission (NAM). Rs. 3329.500 Lakhs were indicated to them as resource pool.

Accordingly, Mission Directorate decided to consider State Annual Action Plan forapproval as appraised by the Appraisal committee subject to condition that State Government has to fulfill conditions of Department of Expenditure issued guidelines vide no. F.N.1(13) PFMS/2020 dated 23.03.2022 and Corrigendum dated 21.06.2022, regarding procedure for release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) and monitoring utilization of the funds.
