<u>Minutes of the Mission Directorate Meeting (Video Conference) of National AYUSH Mission (NAM)</u> for the year 2022-23:

- 1. The Mission Directorate Meeting (Through Video Conference) of the National AYUSH Mission (NAM) for the year 2022-23 was held on 14-06-2022 under the Chairmanship of Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha, Secretary, AYUSH, to consider the State Annual Action Plan (SAAPs) of Chhattisgarh, **Uttarakhand**, West Bengal and Mizoram. List of the participants is enclosed at **Annexure-I**.
- 2. At the outset, Shri D. Senthil Pandiyan, Joint Secretary, AYUSH welcomed the representatives of State Governments to the Mission Directorate meeting and briefed that the State Annual Action Plan (SAAP) for the States of **Uttarakhand**, Chhattisgarh, West Bengal and Mizoram have already been appraised during the Appraisal Committee meeting and detailed observations were communicated to the States.
- 3. Further, it was also informed to the Mission Directorate that during the Appraisal Meetings, a detailed review of progress of Expenditure and PFMS Implementation has been carried out. It was suggested that State Governments has to expedite the progress of expenditure and to ensure submission of UCs of at least 75% of the previous released grants-in-aid. Further, it is also required to fulfill the compliance of different conditionalities including PFMS implementation which are the necessary criteria for release of grant as per the direction issued by the Department of Expenditure vide no. F.N.1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2021.
- 4. After that a brief presentation made by Dr. Suresh Kumar, Deputy Adviser (Ayu.) for each State highlighting the following aspects of
- i. Year-wise Progress of expenditure and status of UCs submitted under NAM
- ii. Status of AYUSH HWCs
- iii. Status of setting up of up to 50 Bedded integrated AYUSH Hospitals
- iv. Status of New AYUSH Educational Institutions.
- v. Status of submitted SAAP during 2022-23.
- vi. Status of implementation of PFMS.

The State-wise detailed observation are enclosed in ANNEXURE-II.

Uttarakhand

Mission Directorate reviewed the Expenditure & Utilization Certificates status of the State Govt. against the previous years grants-in-aid released to the State under the NAM scheme, Status of PFMS implementation, Status of Ayush HWCs, Status of submitted State Annual Action Plan and made the following observations and recommendations:

Expenditure & Utilization Certificates

- Status of Expenditure: Under NAM, an amount of Rs. 10964.224 Lakhs (Centre Share Rs. 9873.849 Lakhs and State Share –Rs.1090.375 lakhs) has been approved from the year 2014-15 to 2021-22. State Govt. has reported an expenditure of Rs. 6073.429 lakhs (61.51%) against central share and Rs. 534.178 lakhs (40%) against the State share to Ministry.
- It was observed that an amount of Rs. 372.504 lakhs of Central share and Rs. 86.458 lakhs of State share are lying pending the in the State treasury. In this regard, it was suggested that State Government has to take appropriate steps for transfer of funds from State treasury to Single Nodal account. Accordingly, Secretary AYUSH, Govt. of Uttarakhand informed that the funds lying in treasury will be withdrawn within a week and also informed that 75% of expenditure will be achieved within 1 month.

• <u>Status of Utilization Certificates</u>:

State has submitted UCs for an amount of Rs. 5692.328 lakhs (67.32%) including refund of Rs. 754.684 lakhs against the total UCs due of Rs. 8455.897 lakhs. In the meeting, it was suggested that State has to ensure effective utilization of release grant in time bound manner and submission of the UCs for the same to the Ministry. Further, during the meeting it was suggested that the State Govt. has to explore the possibility for returning the unspent amount lying with the State Govt. within 1 week. In this regard, Secretary AYUSH, Govt. Of Uttarakhand informed that they will expedite the process of utilization of released grant-in-aid and submit Utilization Certificates for the same at the earliest.

Joint Secretary (Ayush), highlighted that as per issued guidelines of Dept. of Expenditure of dated 23.03.2021,it is required that State Government has to take immediate steps regarding the transfer of released Central Share from State treasury to Single Nodal Account (SNA) at the earliest (within a period of 21 days of its receipt) and they have to also ensure that corresponding State Share should also be released as early as possible and not later than the 40 days of release of Central Share and to utilize the 75% of the released amount (both Central and State share).

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It was appraised during the meeting that a DO letter has been issued by the Finance Secretary, Dept. of Expenditure to the Chief Secretaries of all State /UT Governments vide D.O. No. 1(13)/PFMS/2020 dated 13-04-2022, with a request that the Central share of funds for a CSS, released by the Government of India to the Consolidated Fund of the State, should reach the Single Nodal Agency (SNA) account in 21 days. Further, it was also highlighted in the letter that a check has been operationalized in PFMS that if a previous installment of Central share released by the Government of India has not reached from State Treasury to SNA's account, sanction order for subsequent installment of Central share will not be generated.

Status of PFMS

The State is on-board on PFMS.

- Total approval -300 (70 units during the year 2020-21 and 230 units during the year 2021-22)
- Amount released Rs. 3116.790 Lakh
- Expenditure Rs. 361.32 Lakh (11.59 %)

It was highlighted by Secretary Ayush during the meeting that State officials of Government have to orient themselves with respect to different guidelines of the National Ayush Mission Scheme and they have to establish a hierarchy in referral mechanism from Ayush dispensary up to primary and secondary care level hospitals available in the State so that appropriate health services may be provided to the beneficiaries through different Ayush health facilities.

Status of State Annual Action Plan (SAAP)

The State Government has submitted the revised State Annual Action Plan of the year 2022-23 for an amount of **Rs.4283.89 Lakhs** under National AYUSH Mission (NAM) against the resource pool of **Rs. 3488.20lakhs**.

Accordingly, Mission Directorate decided to consider State Annual Action Plan for approval as appraised by Appraisal committee subject to condition that State Government has to fulfill conditions of Department of Expenditure issued guidelines vide no. F. N. 1(13) PFMS/FCD/2020 dated 23.03.2021, regarding procedure for release of funds under the Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) and monitoring utilization of the funds.
